Year 2

Year 3

In English, we studied the book 'Jemmy Button'. Children considered what type of character Jemmy was and created some writing. They have focused on improving their handwriting and the difference is phenomenal. In Mathematics, we continued developing multiplication knowledge; the class improved their accuracy and speed with their 4 and 8-times tables, looking at the link between them. Keep practising TT Rockstars.

In Design Technology, the children have designed and created pencil cases, using a running stitch. History focused on Ancient Greece, including Greek culture, such as what women and men wore and how the Olympics came about. We also discussed how democracy and how it has changed.



Year 4



This term, Year 4 have been transported back to the Viking times in English with their class text 'Arthur and the Golden Rope.' They have masterfully described the heroic main character, the villainous wolf and retold the story with amazing detail. Year 4 have been working hard to conquer their times tables in maths, looking closely at many tables before venturing into the links to division and working their way up the leader boards on 'Times Table Rock Stars.'

Year 4 have created beautifully intricate work in Art based on the local artist Phillip Gornall, carefully examining the architecture of Liverpool's iconic landscape to produce marvellous masterpieces. They displayed their love for the Viking mythology in DT, creating mesmerising pop up books showcasing their monstrous mythical beasts.

Year 4 have been exploring sound in science. They have been wonderfully curious and excited to deconstruct exactly how we hear sounds day to day and how the noises of the world around us affects our day to day lives. They have also been exploring the Anglo-Saxons in history, looking at who they were, how they shaped our country and how their legacy left us with many places names today. They particularly enjoyed using atlases to discover how many places today originate from the Anglo-Saxons.

Year 5

Year 5 have had a wonderful start to the Spring term filled with lots of exciting things. In English, the children have been enjoying the story of 'King Kong' and will be writing their own dilemma narrative after February half term. 'Shadow Forest' has been the class novel and the children have shown great interest and enthusiasm with this wonderful book and have been eager to find out what happens next. The children have focussed on learning their multiplication tables through recall and have made good improvements with this alongside their usual power maths lessons. They have enjoyed working with gaming designers to design and create their own game. Earlier in the term, the children were visited by a graffiti artist who worked with them to practice their spray paint skills. Safety Central was another exciting visit for the children where they enjoyed learning about how to keep safe in an interactive way. As well as this, the children met poet lan Bland and received a wonderful workshop with him which they all thoroughly enjoyed. The half term was finished off with a wonderful residential to Condover Hall where the children had the opportunity to participate in many fantastic activities.







Year 6 have continued to work really hard on their writing and have been studying 'A Story Like the Wind' by Gill Lewis. The children have learnt how to use a semi-colon in their writing and have developed their use of figurative language to build powerful images for the reader.

Mathematics lessons have focused on fractions, decimals and percentages. Pupils have also been developing their understanding of how to calculate the area and perimeter of shapes as well as converting grams and kilograms.

In History, the children have been learning about the Ancient Mayans. They have watched video clips which showed what life was like, have found out what houses were like and know about the famous wonder of the world – the Chichen Itza.

We have been lucky enough to take part in cricket sessions this half term and the children have been able to develop their hand-eye coordination skills when batting and fielding.

DT week has been another success this half term. Everyone developed their sewing skills, learning how to use different stitches such as back stitch and blanket stitch and made their own bags.
